

Shopping Centre

Guildford

This shopping centre is a popular retail destination in Surrey and contains more than 40 retailers.

The centre wanted to re-tile their washrooms to match their prestigious image. We worked with the designer and suggested Molten Panorama – a metallic-looking stone tile that is easy to keep clean, perfect for walls in hygiene-sensitive environments.

Church of the Resurrection

Mirfield

Built in the late nineteenth century, the Church of the Resurrection in Yorkshire is now a listed building and a place of holy pilgrimage. It was in need of restoration after heating and electrical failures, and extensive plans were laid out to level the church's many tiers and steps to make it more accessible to visitors.

Working closely with the architect and contractor, Kinorigo's task was to create a visual gradient of red to white tile from one end of the church to the other. Many different options were reviewed, from resin to inkjet printing, but with our extensive product knowledge we were able to recommend a natural looking tile with a subtle blend – providing a sample board to aid visualisation.

The use of five different colours was instrumental in creating the right atmosphere desired in different areas of the church. We used curved cutting to create the right blend of contrast and demarcation in just the right places. The result was a stunningly elegant, warm and welcoming finish to the restoration.

Around the World

This renowned provider of international cruises boasts a number of small, elegant ships that are known for their sociable atmosphere.

We were asked to assist in a ship renovation. It was paramount to the project that we acted swiftly and provided slip-resistant materials to be used in bathroom and retail areas. We aimed to utilise the tiles to create a luxury atmosphere without compromising on health and safety.

With this in mind, we provided samples to the ship owners and interior designers. The final choice was Panorama Fusion Ivory Treadsafe – a non-slip processed porcelain sourced from Italy.

By managing the logistics to Europe and delivering pre-cut tiles to ensure minimal effort on-site, we were able to deliver quickly and efficiently – and with savings compared to other products being considered.

The client loved the results and is eager to repeat the installation with more of their ships.

Carradale

Oxfordshire

Carradale is a private residence in Oxfordshire. The client wanted to create a beautiful home, which included a bespoke staircase and outside terrace.

We provided various samples to the client, sealed to show the different finishes available. By also providing a step-by-step brief of the process – from design to installation – the client was able to oversee his project with clarity and confidence.

Three different stones were implemented in this project. Jerusalem Gold Limestone - for the stairs and main indoor areas, Cremona Travertine - for the bathroom and Sandstone paving - for the exterior paving. Limestone and travertine were popular building materials used in ancient Rome – from public baths to the Colosseum itself – so they evoke a sense of classic grandeur.

Templates for the project were done on-site and sent directly to the quarry. Extra slabs were brought across from the quarry so custom pieces could be manufactured at short notice.

By using a light colour scheme to enhance large spaces, our tiles created an airy, sophisticated atmosphere.
